INTERESTING PLACES TO VISIT



GENERAL BUTLER State Resort Park

Located along I-71 between Louisville and Cincinnati, the park is a fitting tribute to one of Kentucky's foremost military families. Named for General William Orlando Butler, the military family spans from colonial time through the American Revolution, War of 1812, Mexican War and Civil War. A stone overlook was built by the Civilian Conservation Corps in the early 1930s so guests can enjoy the same river scenes the Butlers viewed in times past.

GENERAL BUTLER LODGE

General Butler Lodge is the essence of river town charm, featuring the warm glow of polished brass and rich woodwork. Each of the 53 guest rooms features a private balcony or patio overlooking the pool or hillside, with select rooms now pet-friendly. Gift shop offers a selection of Kentucky handcrafts.

ACTIVITIES & AMENITIES

BUTLER-TURPIN HISTORIC HOME*

- Operated by the Friends of General Butler
- This antebellum home, built in 1859, features an 18th and 19th century collection and archaeological exhibit from the 1790 Butler cabin
- The house is a three-bay, two-story structure built in the Greek revival style
- "Butler's Grove" was once a site of political rallies, encampments and a working farm

FISHING

- Plenty of fish in 30-acre Butler Lake, including bass, crappie, bluegill and catfish
- Fishing permitted from the lake shore and from personal non-motorized boats

GENERAL BUTLER GOLF COURSE

This 9-hole course is very hilly so be prepared for some extra exercise if you are walking. The course challenges you with greens that are flat and fast, and with rough that is deep in certain areas.

The most demanding hole is #8, a 330-yard, par 4, requiring a tee shot from a ridge onto the fairway below, and then an approach shot onto a 5,400-square-foot green with plenty of contour. There is an additional set of men's tees that can be used when playing an 18-hole round.
