Carr Creek State Park

Enjoy a wide range of activities at this park on Carr Creek Lake, which was once home to some of the area's earliest pioneer settlements as early as the 1770s. Carr Fork, a tributary of the North Fork of the Kentucky River, is located 8.8 miles below Carr Creek Dam, and is thought to have gotten its name from William Carr, a well-known "Long Hunter" who hunted in the area. Modern-day visitors to the park can relax amid a chorus of nature in the campground or frolic under the sun at the public beach surrounded by the mountains of southeastern Kentucky. The marsh environment in the Carr Creek area is unusual for the mountains of Eastern Kentucky, but provides a wide assortment of watchable wildlife.

Camping & RV: 39-site campground, all with water and electric hook-ups. Reservations on-line or at 1-888-4KY-PARK.

Fishing: 710-acre lake for pleasure boaters and anglers, with miles of shoreline, offers good bass, crappie and walleye fishing.


Marina: Full-service marina with snack bar located near the park. Pontoon and fishing boat rentals. Open year round. 606-642-3239
