Permanent Course at Big Bone Lick:
 Controls 1 to 10, visited in sequence, provide a beginner level introduction to orienteering. Some trail sections are steep and rocky. Controls 11 to 20 are of intermediate to advanced difficulty and may be visited in any sequence.
 All park rules and regulations must be followed. In the campground area, please avoid passing through occupied campsites or disturbing campers and other visitors. Bison are dangerous! Do not climb fences or approach the fence surrounding the bison enclosure.
